

The following flowcharts were prepared in the IEEE-SA Standards Board (SASB) Reaffirmations Ad Hoc as a non-normative illustration of the proposal being presented for SASB approval. 2 pages are included:

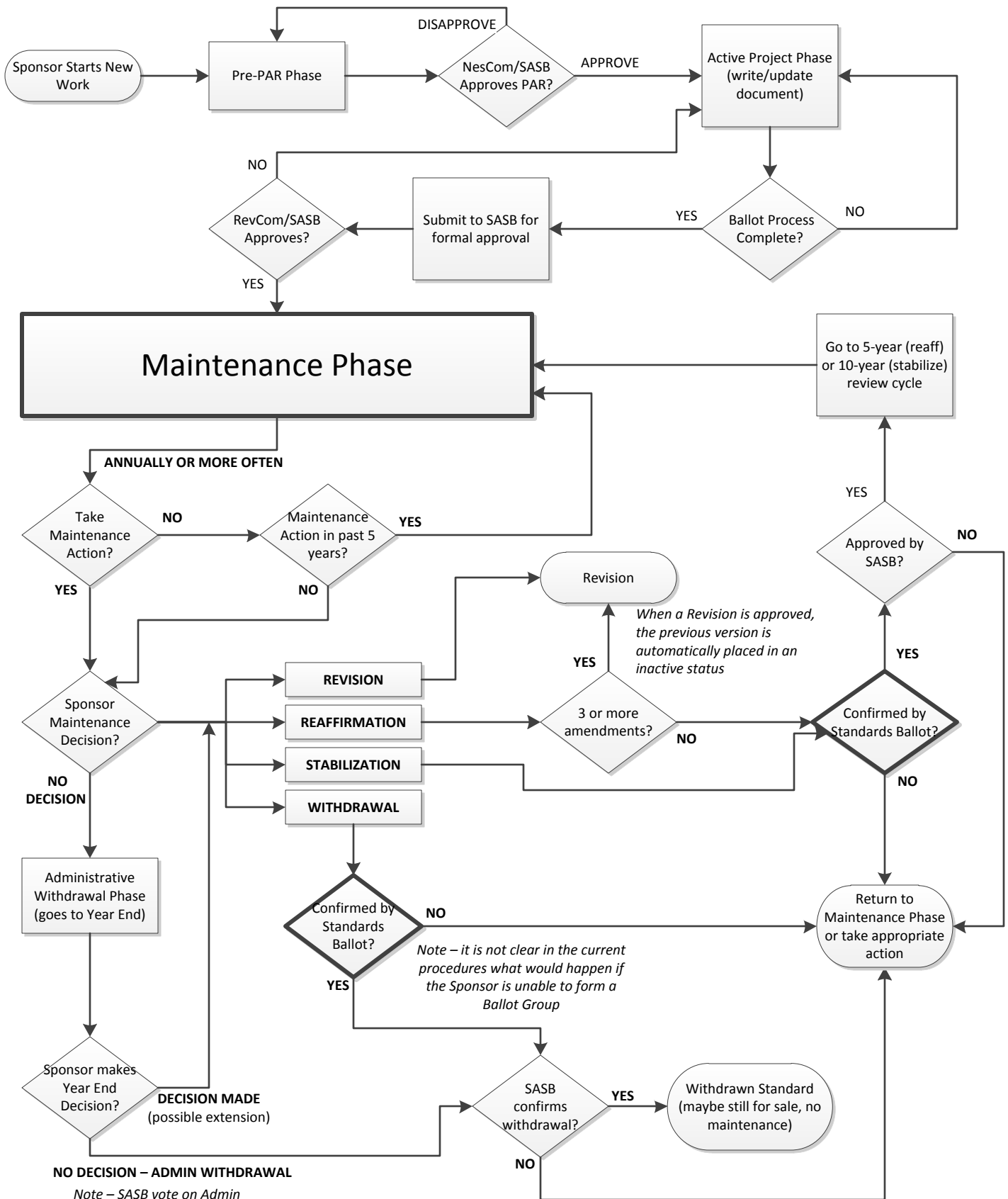
- The current maintenance process as described in the SASB Operations Manual Section 9. This process describes 4 fundamental maintenance actions: Revision, Reaffirmation, Stabilization and Withdrawal. Maintenance actions must be considered every 5 years (10 years if stabilized), and the SASB can take an “Administrative Withdrawal” action to withdraw a standard in certain cases.
- A revision of the maintenance process which eliminates the Reaffirmation and Stabilization actions, and asks that a Sponsor either complete a Revision action or move the Standard to an inactive status within 10 years. The SASB would be able to take an administrative action to move the standard to an inactive status if the Sponsor does nothing by the 10-year mark. The normal ballot process would be used to confirm the request to withdraw the standard before it is sent to RevCom/SASB.

ProCom has approved the Bylaws/OpsMan changes to implement this proposal, and SASB has approved the general concept.

Following an open comment period for Sponsors (to 2/28/2011), SASB will consider approval of the Bylaws/OpsMan changes. As IEEE-SA Board of Governor approval and education/transition must happen, the implementation date may be 1/1/2012.

Implementation/transition comments/questions are appropriate now to insure they are addressed in the coming months.

## Maintenance of IEEE Standards (SASB OpsMan Section 9)



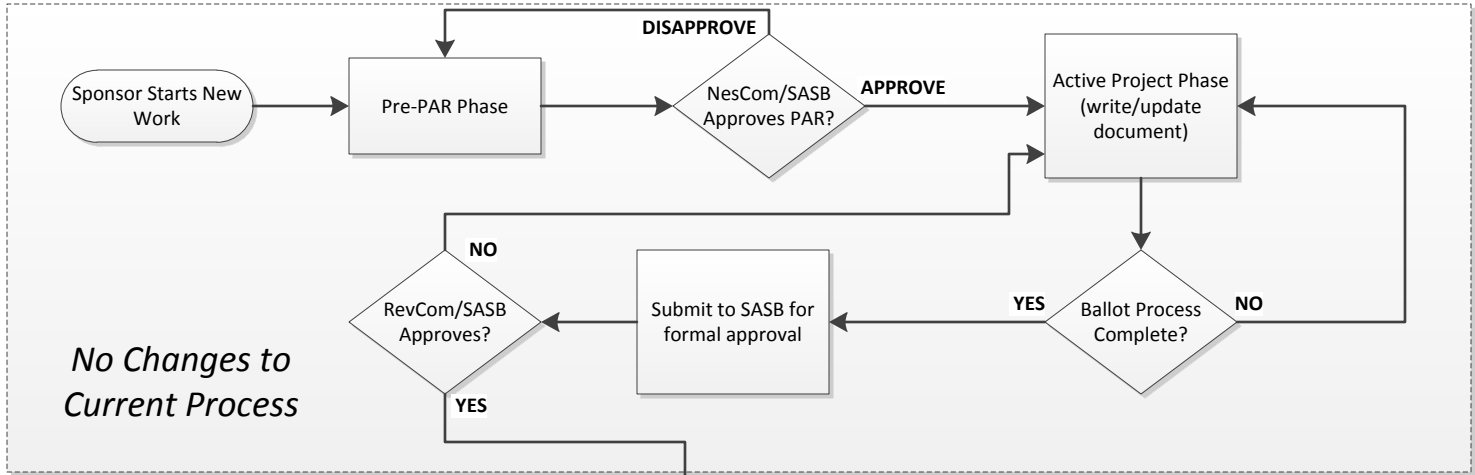
**NO DECISION – ADMIN WITHDRAWAL**
